About the Africa Project Finance Program

On average, less than 35 PPP projects in Africa reach financial close every year, against a growing infrastructure financing gap. It is very clear that the current approach adopted by many countries will never address the financing challenge.

The Africa Project Finance Program is Miundo Misingi's flagship response to this challenge. It is a structured, PPP transaction oriented and immersive three-month training program that blends live virtual instruction, case-based learning, site visit to an ongoing PPP project and real-world project exposure through the action learning Labs.

Since its launch in 2021, the program has welcomed over 500 mid to senior professionals from ministries, regulators, investment firms, advisory practices and project implementation units. Participants represent a wide range of countries and sectors. Our goal is to build a strong African-led community of infrastructure finance professionals capable of shaping sustainable, impactful development projects.

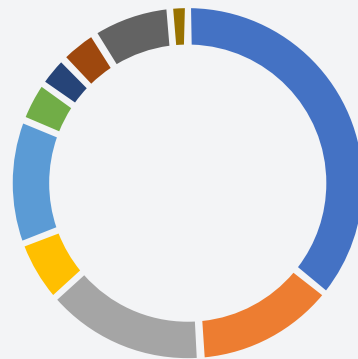

Training Curriculum

Month 1, Module 1

Introduction to the fundamentals of infrastructure projects

Since the training brings together learners from different professional backgrounds, the objective of this Module is to provide a strong foundation on infrastructure projects, allowing participants to learn about the conceptualization of projects, procurement options, accounting and reporting for infrastructure projects.

- **Unit 1:** Introduction to infrastructure needs and projects
 - **Unit 2:** Introduction to the procurement options for public infrastructure projects; public procurement and PPP model
 - **Unit 3:** Analysis of Engineering Procurement and Construction (EPC) contracts; Contract, scope, programme of works, invoicing schedules, pricing schedules, monthly closing procedures
 - **Unit 4:** Introduction to infrastructure project accounting and reporting; Analysis of related International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs)
 - **Unit 5:** Infrastructure project revenue, cost and cashflow structuring, management and reporting
- 🔸 **Case study:** Introduction to an EPC project in Kenya; Review of project structure, revenue, cost and cashflow planning, key risks and reasons for failures.
 - 🔸 **Guest Expert Session:** Lessons learnt from advising on and managing PPP projects in Africa.

Month 2, Module 2

Infrastructure project finance (6 sessions)

Building on lessons learnt from Module 1, the second module focuses on the financing of infrastructure projects, with a bias on the project finance model. Using case studies, the learners will be taken through the quantitative and qualitative analysis of projects, highlighting how the project financing model can be used to effectively finance public infrastructure projects through the PPP model.

- **Unit 1:** Introduction to infrastructure project finance
 - **Unit 2:** Quantitative analysis in project finance; Debt sizing and structuring in project finance
 - **Unit 3:** Qualitative risk analysis and management in project finance
 - **Unit 4:** Security package, negotiation and legal considerations in project finance
 - **Unit 5:** Emerging financing solutions for infrastructure projects; Focus on Africa

Visit to an infrastructure project

Month 3, Module 3

Structuring, financing and management of PPPs (10 sessions)

Module 3 takes a deep dive into PPPs, looking at the entire PPP cycle from project identification, feasibility studies, structuring of PPP contract and tender package, tendering and award, contract management (construction, operation and hand back).

- **Unit 1:** Introduction to PPPs: How do PPPs work, the interrelationships, roles and responsibilities of the different parties involved.
 - **Unit 2:** Managing the PPP project cycle; Project identification and screening as a PPP
 - **Unit 3:** Project Structuring and Preparation
 - **Unit 4:** Structuring the PPP contract and tender package
 - **Unit 5:** Tendering of PPP project and award of contract
 - **Unit 6:** Managing the PPP contract; construction and operation phases
 - **Unit 7:** Managing the project hand over

Applied Learning Labs



Site Visit - 1 Day

The program includes a site visit to an ongoing infrastructure project in Kenya, providing participants with a unique opportunity to engage directly with government officials and representatives of the implementing private partner. This immersive experience offers first-hand insight into the practical realities of project implementation, including stakeholder coordination, risk management, and on-the-ground challenges. By bridging theory with real-world exposure, the visit deepens participants' understanding of how PPP projects are executed and the complexities involved in delivering them successfully.



PPP Deal Modelling Lab - 4 sessions

The PPP Deal Modelling Lab is a hands-on, immersive experience where participants work with faculty to develop a PPP financial model from scratch based on a selected PPP project. Step by step, participants will build and structure the model—covering key assumptions, revenues, costs, financing, and risk allocation—while also integrating cost-benefit analysis and value for money assessment to ensure projects are not only financially viable but economically justified. Beyond building the model, the Lab focuses on interpretation and real-world application. Participants will learn how to analyze outputs such as IRRs, DSCRs, and sensitivities, and use these insights to inform decision-making and strengthen their position in negotiations with investors, lenders, and public sector stakeholders. By the end, participants will be equipped to develop bankable models and use them as practical tools to structure and negotiate PPP deals effectively.



PPP Transaction Management & Bid Preparation Lab - 4 sessions

The PPP Transaction Management & Bid Preparation Lab is a hands-on, end-to-end simulation of the PPP transaction, bringing together public and private sector perspectives. Using a selected project, participants will work through key stages—from project preparation and procurement design to tender management, bid evaluation, and contract award—while building practical skills in managing transparent processes and preparing competitive, compliant bids.

The Lab focuses on execution and strategy, equipping participants to manage advisors, navigate stakeholder dynamics, and address transaction risks. Private sector participants will refine bid strategy and documentation, while public sector participants strengthen their ability to run efficient, credible processes. By the end, participants gain a clear, practical understanding of both sides of the transaction and how to drive successful PPP outcomes.



Optional: Certified Public-Private Partnership Professional (CP3P) examination - 4 sessions

Participants will have a unique opportunity to attend Certified Public-Private Partnerships Professional (CP3P) Foundation Level Exam Readiness Sessions, designed to prepare them for the Foundation level certification offered by APMG International in PPPs. The program includes specialized training, access to a dedicated learning platform, and mock exams to ensure participants are fully prepared. The certification exam can be taken at the end of the course, with only the exam registration fees applicable. This initiative provides a valuable chance for participants to enhance their professional credentials with an internationally respected qualification.
